Samples of Badi Haveli and Chamkaur Shaib, have failed to qualify the permissible limits criteria prescribed by the Board. **PWSSB** 2 Nos. tenders were received for 2 MLD Sewage Treatment Plant to be installed at Kiratpur Sahib but due to higher rates quoted by the agency, tenders not approved. Consequently, minutes of meeting were issued vide PPCB letter no. 27152-53 dated 18.12.2020 to amend the effluent standards for the new STPs of capacity <5 MLD to ensure technoeconomic viability. Therefore, tender is being recalled by revising the effluent standards in compliance to the above. • The untreated wastewater Kiratpur Sahib town was being Chairperson directed Executive disposed off in drain leading to

Engineer, PWSSB to divert the untreated sewage falling into Charan Ganga latest by 10<sup>th</sup> October and PSPCL to release the electric connection to MPS within one week.

Charan Ganga upstream of Gurdwara Patalpuri Sahib where the people pay the last tributes to the persons gone heavenly. Under urban mission project, the work of sewer around Gurudwara Patalpuri Sahib and construction of Main Pumping Station was executed.
