Counter affidavit filed on behalf of respondent No.3 and the documents enclosed therewith indicate that a large number of notices have been issued to the ~~X~~ Hotels, Restaurants, Resorts, Marriage Palaces and Automobile Workshops with wet process for violation of the provisions of The Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and The Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981. Some of these establishments have applied for grant of consent and renewal while others have not.

Learned counsel appearing for Punjab Pollution Control Board-respondent No.3 submits that in cases where no request for grant of consent has been received, the Board shall take appropriate steps and issue appropriate orders for closure and institute proceedings for prosecution of the establishments within three months from today. In cases, where requests for grant or renewal have been received from the establishments, he prays for six months time to do the needful. Time prayed for is granted. The Board shall file a status report about the action taken in both the categories mentioned above on or before the next date of hearing.

The affidavit filed by Mr. Khosla, Addl. Advocate General, Punjab is taken on record.
