**CASES OF ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE = 01**

M/s Max Speciality Films Ltd., Village Railmajra, Tehsil Balachaur, District Nawanshahr	<p>The case was considered by the SCA-cum-SAC in its 97<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 25.04.2017, wherein the SCA-cum-SAC observed that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The case stands recommended by all the member departments except PCCF.</li> <li>• PCCF vide letter No. 751 dated 11.04.2017 has informed that DFO Nawanshahr vide letter No. 64-67 dated 07.04.2017 has reported that the user agency has been asked number of times to submit NOC from NHAI and approved site plan and the industry has again been written vide letter No. 7894 dated 29.03.2017. But the industry has not submitted the same upto 07.04.2017. The PCCF further informed that on completion of observations by the user agency and on receipt of case from DFO, Nawanshahr, the case of the user agency will be sent to the Punjab Govt. for according approval.</li> </ul> <p>It was apprised to SCA-cum-SAC that the industry vide letter No. 24.04.2017 has submitted the copy of NOC (temporary access permission) issued by the NHAI to the industry vide letter No. 1525 dated 20.04.2017.</p> <p>Representative of PCCF informed that the NOC as issued by the NHAI has been received in</p>

their office on 24.04.2017 only and the case of the user agency will be examined and sent to Govt. of India, on merits.

After discussions, it was unanimously decided that:

- (i) PCCF will expedite the matter personally and send the conclusive recommendations in the matter including the comments on the observations earlier raised by the PCCF from time to time, immediately.
- (ii) Case be put up in the next meeting of SCA-cum-SAC.

Road, Goraya, District Jalandhar	<p>The case was considered by the SCA-cum-SAC in its 97<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 25.04.2017, wherein the SCA-cum-SAC observed that the representative of DOA submitted letter No. 887/JDA (HG) dated 24.04.2017 in the meeting on 25.04.2017 vide which it has been recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry subject to the condition that the industry will obtain the permission from Central Ground Water Board regarding abstraction of groundwater and will comply with the conditions issued by the Central Ground Water Authority for 'notified areas' and the District Advisory Committee will monitor the same. The representative of DOA has also submitted a copy of the proceedings of the District Advisory Committee held on 16.03.2017.</p> <p>The SCA-cum-SAC perused the said proceedings, wherein it has been mentioned that as per the decision taken in the District Advisory Committee in its meeting held on 13.01.2017, the industry has applied for water supply connection to the Water Supply Department, obtained NOC for the same and submitted a copy thereof to the office of Deputy Commissioner, Jalandhar. - (ii) DOA will pursue the case on day-to-day basis and to coordinate with the Deputy Commissioner, Jalandhar for convening the next meeting of DAC and to send the final recommendations in the matter, immediately.
- (iii) Defer the case and be put up in the next meeting of SCA-cum-SAC alongwith the conclusive recommendations of the Agriculture Department.

2. M/s R.V. Industries, 86, Kangniwal, Near Jandu Singha, Jalandhar  
The case was considered by the SCA-cum-SAC in its 97<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 25.04.2017, wherein the SCA-cum-SAC observed that the representative of DOA submitted letter No. 885/JDA (HG) dated 24.04.2017 in the meeting on 25.04.2017 vide which it has been recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry subject to the condition that the industry will obtain the permission from Central Ground Water Board regarding abstraction of groundwater and will comply with the conditions issued by the Central Ground Water Authority for 'notified areas' and the District Advisory Committee will monitor the same. The representative of DOA has also submitted a copy of the proceedings of the District Advisory Committee held on 16.03.2017.

The SCA-cum-SAC perused the said proceedings, wherein it has been mentioned that as per the decision taken in the District Advisory Committee in its meeting held on 13.01.2017, the industry has applied for water supply connection to the Water Supply Department, obtained NOC for the same and submitted a copy thereof to the office of Deputy Commissioner, Jalandhar. 3. M/s S.S. Concast Pvt. Ltd., Village Panjetha, Machiwara Road, Ludhiana  
The case was considered by the SCA-cum-SAC in its 97<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 25.04.2017, wherein the SCA-cum-SAC observed that
  - Punjab Pollution Control Board has recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry.
  - DOI and CTP have also recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry vide letter No. 3869-A dated 21.04.2017 and letter No. 1538 CTP (Pb)/SL-185 dated 24.04.2017, respectively.
  - DOF vide Endst. No. 4039-40 dated 07.04.2017 has informed that the Department has conveyed observations to the industry vide letter No. 3207 dated 07.03.2017 and again vide letter No. 4038 dated 07.04.2017 to the effect that the On Site Emergency Plan attached with the application is not as per Schedule 8-A of Punjab Major Accident Hazardous Rules, 2002 and requested the industry to submit the same, so that further necessary action may be taken in the matter.

After discussions, it was unanimously decided as under:-

- (i) Observations of DOF be again conveyed to the industry for compliance and for submitting the compliance report directly to DOF under

intimation to SCA-cum-SAC.

- (ii) DOF shall process the case and will send the fresh recommendations in the matter, immediately on receipt of reply from the industry.
- (iii) Defer the case and be put up in the next meeting of SCA-cum-SAC alongwith the fresh recommendations of DOF.

4. M/s Goel Solvents, The case was considered by the SCA-cum-SAC in its  
Bhedpuri Road, Samana, 97<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 25.04.2017, wherein the SCA-cum-  
District Patiala SAC observed that:

- PPCB, IMD, CTP, DOF & DHS have recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry.
- PCCF has also recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry vide letter No. 288 dated 19.04.2017.
- Fire Station Officer, Samana vide letter No. 602 dated 12.04.2017 has informed that the project proponent has been asked to submit the maps/drawings duly marked with the safety fire arrangements as per Part-4 of National Building Code, but the project proponent has not submitted the same. Fire Officer, Samana further informed that if the project proponent submits the same and obtains the provisional NOC from their office, then they have no objection for grant of site clearance to the industry.

Subsequently, Fire Officer, Samana vide letter No. 617 dated 24.04.2017 has further informed that the industry has submitted the required drawings/maps and provisional NOC has been issued to the firm vide letter No. 616 dated 24.04.2017 and now they have no objection for grant of site clearance to the industry.

- DOA has also recommended for grant of site clearance to the industry vide letter No. 889/JDA (HG) dated 24.04.2017, which was submitted during the meeting on 25.04.2017.
- Comments awaited from DOI. Representative of DOI informed that the file for issuance of site clearance to the industry has been put up to the Director of Industries & Commerce, but the same could not be cleared as the Director of Industries & Commerce was on tour for last 3-4 days.

After discussions, it was unanimously decided that the case be deferred to the next meeting and the representative of DOI was directed to send the comments, immediately.

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
