Now, in OA no. 360/2018 titled as Shree Nath Sharma V/s Union of India, the Hon'ble NGT vide order dated 26.09.2019 has directed to constitute District Environment Committee for preparation and monitoring of District Environment Plan. Accordingly, Now, the Department of Science, Technology and Environment vide order no. 10/352/2018-STE(5)/1605949/1 dated 31.10.2019, in compliance to the said orders of the Hon'ble NGT, has constituted District Environment Committee (DEC).

The details regarding various functions of the DEC, powers of the DEC and reports to be submitted by the DEC are given in the notification dated 31.10.2019. Also, with issuance of this notification, the already constituted District Level Special Task Force is no more in existence.

2. In the notification dated 31.10.2019 it has been mentioned that the District Level Action Plan is to be prepared considering following 14 thematic areas:
