1	Formulation of policy by State Government	Policy is yet to be finalized by the Department of Local Government, Punjab.

4	Monitoring by SPCBs	Monitoring by the Board will be started after commissioning of the processing facilities.

**Annexure-II**

- 1) The Principal Secretary to Government of Punjab, Department of Local Government has been requested vide letter no. 7573 dated 27.09.2018 to issue necessary directions to all concerned Departments to ensure compliance of the provisions of these Rules and also for setting up of processing or recycling facilities for construction and demolition waste.
- 2) The Hon'ble National Green Tribunal, New Delhi vide orders dated 20.08.2018 in matter of OA No. 606/2018 titled as Compliance of Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 has constituted the following committees:
  - Apex Monitoring Committee (AMC): The Committee has to interact with the concerned Ministries and the Regional Monitoring Committees. It may formulate guidelines/directions which may be useful to the Regional Monitoring Committees and the States/Union Territories.
  - State Level Monitoring Committee (SLMC): The Committees have to interact with the Local Bodies preferably once in two weeks. The Local Bodies has to furnish report to the State Committees twice a month. The Committees has to take a call on technical and policy issues in accordance with the Rules, 2016 consistent with directions of Apex and Regional Monitoring Committees. The meetings of the SLMC are being held every month to monitor the progress of implementation of Construction and Demolition Waste Management Rules, 2016.

During these meetings, the Department of Local Government has been directed to stop the dumping of Construction and Demolition Waste at the solid waste dumping sites. The Department of Local Government was also directed to process the C&D waste through its ULBs, as per provisions of Construction and Demolition Waste Management Rules, 2016.
